We mark time in our lives in a variety of ways—officially by a clock and calendar, but we all have informal ways too. The rhythm of the "school year" often governs families more than the calendar year. Our morning routine may be marked by rush hour. Evenings may be timed by our favorite show on TV. The Church has those rhythms too. Our year begins in November with the start of Advent, as we pray for Jesus' coming. Our weeks are marked by worship on Sunday. Our days are marked in prayer.

Daily prayer is an ancient practice of tuning our lives to divine movement. Bracketing daily activity with morning and evening prayer helps to remind us that God is present with us throughout our day. Like a beautiful frame enhances the painting it contains, prayer is the frame that brings our lives into focus.

During Advent you are invited to use the prayers in this book along with the daily devotional book to engage in the practice of daily prayer. You may do this by yourself or choose to join us on Facebook. Daily prayer is offered live on the Koinonia Facebook page:

- ♦ Morning Prayer, 9:00 AM
- ◆ Evening Prayer, 7:00 PM

You may also use the prayers at a time that fits into your schedule, they will be available on each Church's Facebook page for you to use any time. If you choose to only do prayer once each day, morning prayer will include the suggested daily scriptures, while evening prayer will include a reflection on the day's scripture.

In addition, we will be gathering in person for Wednesday evening prayer with music and advent carols. We will take turns gathering at the three church building at 7:00 PM. PRAYERS FOR WEEK ONE

November 28th - December 4th Luke 1:1-22

The Christmas story as we usually think of it is contained mostly in the Gospel of Luke. Each day we will read a couple of verses of the stories leading up to the familiar manger scene. As we begin, we read Luke's introduction and reason for writing the Gospel and encounter Elizabeth and Zechariah, an older couple who have never had children.

The beginnings of the book, and the beginnings for Zechariah and Elizabeth invite us to reflect this week on the beginnings in our life. What new beginnings do you long for from God? How is God beginning something new in your life?

PRAYERS FOR WEEK TWO

December 5th - 11th Luke 1:24-41

fter hearing about the promise to Elizabeth and Zechariah, we hear of the good news given to a young woman named Mary. Both announcements are surprising. Elizabeth is beyond childbearing years, yet God promises her a child. Mary is not yet married, but God promises her a child too. In both cases, we are reminded that God works through surprising and unexpected ways that challenge us.

The annunciation to Mary invites us to consider how God is working in unexpected ways today and using unexpected people. Those dismissed by society as unqualified, undesirable, or unworthy are often the folks God works through the most.

December 12th - 18th

Luke 1:41-71

The story of Jesus' birth, according to Luke's telling, is a story about strong women. Elizabeth and Mary are forefront in the story and it centers around their experience. In the readings for this week we read about their shared encounter and the joy that it brings both of them.

Most familiar in this story is the song which Mary sings, the Magnificat. The song contains both great joy and awe at what God is doing. The importance of this song can be seen in the fact that it is a daily part of evening prayer. A careful reading of this song helps us understand Jesus' purpose in coming to earth and challenges us to see how we are called to be a part of God's plan to transform the world. As you read it, you may wish to consider the ways that God is calling you to be part of the great reversal that Jesus is enacting.

This blessing remained throughout the year. The following liturgy will be incorporated into evening prayer on January 5th. You may join in at the door of your own home. Have a piece of chalk ready. Alternatively, you may use it at a time convenient for you.
